Since 1969, Dare to Care has been working to ensure that no one in Kentuckiana lacks enough food to live an active, healthy life. Our mission is to lead our community to feed the hungry and conquer the cycle of need. This mission would not be realized without our Partner Network. In 2022, we decided to empower our partners even further by launching the Partner Investment Program, allowing us to further support selected programs/projects through funding, to deepen relationships with our partners, and to strengthen our fight against food insecurity.


FOCUS AREAS

Clientcentered programs that may include client-choice pantries, bilingual signage, and medically tailored meals.

PARTNER PROJECTS

AMERICANA COMMUNITY CENTER

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$10,000 People Impacted: 258

Improved food safety and communitybuilding by purchasing a new dishwasher and utensils for the kitchen, fostering dignity and respect for neighbors.

BRINGING JUSTICE HOME

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$9,900 People Impacted: 43

Delivered food staples to medicallyvulnerable individuals and promoted the program with increased ads and marketing. This reduced anxiety for neighbors and reduced food insecurity.

CENTER FOR LAY MINISTRIES

Clark County, IN

Amount Awarded: \$1,900 People Impacted: 12,404

Installed Spanish-English signage and purchased folding wagons for neighbors to transport food home more easily, while accommodating the growing Spanish-speaking population.

FEED LOUISVILLE

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$50,000 People Impacted: 600

New food storage, cooking equipment, and vehicles to advance delivery of hot meals and maintain food safety. Production has doubled from 400 to 800 meals served per day.

HARRISON CO. COMMUNITY SERVICES

Harrison County, IN Amount Awarded: \$25,000 People Impacted: 125

Purchased a new refrigerated trailer to deliver meals to homebound residents. Upgrades have allowed them to reach goal of doubling outreach with consistent and reliable meal deliveries.

HIGHPOINT CHARITABLE SERVICES

Oldham County, KY
Amount Awarded: \$20,000
People Impacted: 500

Created an on-site kitchen to increase access to free, healthy food and classes on nutrition, cooking, and budgeting. This has reduced barriers between neighbors and volunteers.

JEWISH FAMILY & CAREER SERVICES

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$13,700 Households Impacted: 249

Created a grocery- store experience at their pantry and added food pantry curriculum. The welcoming environment has helped neighbors fight isolation and loneliness and funds have expanded service reach.

OVERFLOW COMMUNITY CENTER

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$16,500 People Impacted: 10,000

Purchased shelving, freezers, refrigerators, paint, and signage to transform existing pantry to a client-choice model, resulting in an increase of 20 families per month to 150 per week.

SIMPSONVILLE CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Shelby County, KY

Amount Awarded: \$50,000 People Impacted: 21,000

Purchased new refrigeration and freezer units, a truck for food transport, and office technology to better manage the pantry. The community is noticing better service to neighbors and donating more.

SISTER VISITOR

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$40,000 People Impacted: 26,463

Increased storage, refrigeration displays, and a new vehicle to improve their client-choice pantry. Neighbors visiting from outer service areas increased from 12% to 22%.

SPARC HOPE

Jefferson County, KY Amount Awarded: \$6,000 People Impacted: 85

Implemented a new software program to help manage pantry inventory and share the value of available food with neighbors. More accurate receipting has boosted confidence in services.

TRUSTEES OF IU SOUTHEAST

Floyd County, IN

Amount Awarded: \$7,000 People Impacted: 4,260

Created 5 additional pantries to increase convenience and accessibility for students. This has decreased stigma, kept students in school, and went from serving 781 people to 4,260.
