# **OUR PROGRAMS**

Alongside our partners we offer a range of programs to support some of the most vulnerable members of our community. These programs include Cooking Matters, Kids Cafés, Mobile Pantry, Mobile Market, Prescriptive Pantry, School Pantry and Summer Meals, and Senior Meals. Last year, Dare to Care distributed 21.7 million pounds of food throughout our service area.

## **Cooking Matters**

We empower families with the skills, knowledge and confidence to prepare healthy and affordable meals through our nutrition outreach program.

Adults, families, parents and kids, teens and children can participate through different courses designed for

### Community Kitchen

This 24,000-square-foot facility in the heart of the Parkland neighborhood houses Dare to Care's **production and innovation kitchen**. The facility includes a demonstration kitchen, a classroom and a job-training kitchen (in partnership with Catholic Charities Common Table program).

### **Kids Cafes**

Through partners, such as YMCAs and Boys and Girls Clubs, we *provide nutritious meals to children* through Kids Cafes.

Children receive comfort and nourishment from the meals and are also connected to afterschool programs for academic, social and emotional support.

# **Mobile Pantry**

Started in 2007 to ensure families can access nutritious food regardless of where they live, we now operate more than 40 mobile pantries each month.

These pantries provide nearly 275,000 pounds of nutritious food to our neighbors in need each year.

In partnership with medical providers, we provide *nutritious food items to food-insecure families who are visiting a health clinic*.

Offering nutritious food helps physicians address medical problems and meet the whole health needs of their patients.

## **School Pantry/Summer Meals**

During the school year, we **connect students at risk of hunger with healthy foods** in their school setting. In the summer months, we deliver breakfast, lunch and dinner to food-insecure families across our community when access to nutrition is more difficult.

#### **Senior Meals**

Through mobile pantries and the Commodities Supplemental Food Program, a federal program that works to *improve the health of low-income individuals* 60 years and older, we provide nutritional foods to seniors in our community.

#### Zero Hunger Mobile Market

Our single-aisle grocery store on wheels allows community residents with limited access to fresh foods to shop for produce and other food items.
